

FUTURE PROJECTS

LVAP currently has a dedicated fervor to extend assistance into remote, distant and faraway villages: these communities still have insufficient resources to develop positive and affirming educational environments. In partnering with local isolated communities, LVAP aims to:

- construct / fully equip bright, stimulating Early Childhood Learning Centres in:
 1. Cà Mau (350 kilometres from HCMC Province)
 2. Phú Yên (530 kilometres from HCMC Province)
- refurbish/ fully equip a computer room for hearing-impaired students in Phú Yên Province (530 kilometres from HCMC Province)
- construct/ fully equip a new Primary School for cover 550 students (currently attending a school in appalling conditions) in District 9 (50 kilometres from HCMC Province)
- construct/ fully equip a Library/ Educational/ Resource Room for students at a rural shelter (70 kilometres from HCMC Province) to give them ancillary activities to enhance their schooling/ leisure time.
